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Statement of Requirements

A minor in Global Health, Culture, and Society requires a minimum of **seven courses (21CU)**: one Foundational course (HLTH 250 Foundations of Global Health); one Methods course; two Perspectives in Global Health Studies (only *one* can be at the 200-level and students are encouraged to take *one* area studies and *one* interdisciplinary perspectives course); one Global Health Challenges course; the HLTH 350 Capstone course; and one approved elective course. The total courses must represent at least **two** different departments. No course taken using S/U option may be applied towards the minor. Individual courses may not be used to fulfill two program requirements (i.e., Area studies AND Methods) simultaneously. Only **one** class can be double-counted for your major and the GHCS minor. Successful completion requires a GPA ≥ 2.0 within the minor. Other courses taken at Emory or abroad, or internships with an academic component, may be considered for the GHCS elective by petition.
